

Reasonable Adjustments

Under the Equality Act 2010 schools are required to make reasonable adjustments to support pupils with extra needs so that they are able to join in as many school activities as possible. The duty on the school is to avoid placing the child at a substantial disadvantage.

PHYSICAL ACCOMMODATIONS

Alteration of steps and stairs (provision of ramps or lifts)

Levelling or widening of passageways and paths

Widening of entrances and exits

Adapting internal and external doors for ease of access – installing sliding or bifold doors or electronic opening devices

Making toilets accessible
